Better Locking Handles

The OneTouch Winch Handle (\$110, for the Power Grip) from Lewmar is the first major development of the lowly winch handle in a couple of decades. Experienced sailors use

the locking mechanism on a winch handle as naturally as lifting a rum bottle, but we've all seen newer sailors struggle to get a locked handle out of a winch. The OneTouch handle changes that. It has the release trigger along the back of the handle so that merely grabbing it and giving it a squeeze will release the lock. We think the old salts aboard will also quickly come to appreciate the intuitive operation of it.

The Starpath School of Navigation presents Bowditch in a one-DVD or two-CD set called *Bowditch Plus!* (\$60), along with all nine volumes of the *U.S. Coast Pilot*; the seven-volume U.S. Coast Guard *Light List*; *Navigation Rules: International-Inland; Chart No. 1: United States of America Nautical Symbols, Abbreviations, and Terms*; the 42 volumes of the worldwide *Sailing Directions*; pilot charts of the North Atlantic Ocean, the South Pacific Ocean, and the Indian Ocean; the *Worldwide Marine Radiofacsimile Broadcast Schedules*, the worldwide weatherfax schedule; and all of the volumes of both sight-reduction tables (HO 229 and HO 249).
